#### WARNING: IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

Read all instructions and the following safety information carefully prior to installation and use. Failure to do so may result in serious injury or death.

Do not install this product if your garage door operator is not equipped with photo-eye sensors, or if it cannot be adjusted so that the door reverses direction when encountering an obstruction with the slightest amount of pressure. If your operator is not equipped with such safety devices, the installer may require you to install a new operator before installing the Lifestyle garage screen. Failure to comply with these directions may result in serious injury or death and or damage to your Lifestyle garage screen, garage door or other property.

Please refer to operator instruction manual for proper adjustment parameters. Do not exceed the operator manufacturer's recommendations for safe adjustment of the operator. Failure to do so may result in serious injury or death. Final adjustment of the operator must comply with operator manufacturer's recommendations. Failure to do so may result in serious injury or death.

Red fasteners on garage door systems are under tension. Do not remove or tamper with any fasteners, screws or bolts that are red in color. Failure to do so may result in serious injury or death.

Moving the screen can cause serious injury or death. Keep people and pets clear of opening when operating the screen. An overhead screen is a large heavy object that moves with the help of springs that are under high tension loads. Since moving objects and springs under high tension can cause serious injuries, your safety and proper operation of the screen depend on you doing the following:

- Keep the screen in full view and free of obstruction when in operation;
- Do not allow children to operate the screen;
- Do not close or operate the screen if people or pets are in the door opening;
- Do not hang or place excessive downward force on the nylon closing straps;
- Do not stand on any object when operating the screen;
- Do not place fingers, hand or other body parts between the screen and the door jambs when operating the screen;
- Do not operate your garage door when the screen is in the closed vertical orientation;
- Do not tamper with or remove the photo eye blocker installed on the screen;
- Check the hardware on the screen at least monthly for worn or broken parts, adjustment and balance.
- Do not operate the screen with broken springs, cables or other parts;
- Repairs and adjustments of the screen should be performed exclusively by a trained professional.

Do not cover over or paint over any warning signs and decals.

#### Before Installing the Lifestyle Screens garage screen

- The Lifestyle garage screen cannot be installed in combination with a low headroom garage door installation.
- Check for clearances in the following situations: cabinets mounted on the side wall next to the garage door track; entry doors from the home to the garage that open into the garage should clear several inches below the garage door tracks or away from the tracks, any side doors next to the garage door should not interfere with the Lifestyle screen tracks.
- Ensure that the garage door is completely out of the opening and secured from closing.
- Disengage the garage door operator arm.
- Raise the garage door well beyond the vertical opening and clamp with vise grips to hold the garage door in place.
- Once the Lifestyle screen is installed, you may need to adjust the travel on the operator and/or the operator J-Bar may need to be cut down and/or assembled in a different set of holes. This is to ensure that the operator arm does not hit the Lifestyle screen during operation of the garage door.







## **Updated Parts**






- 1. Adjust up-limit on garage door opener shown in (A) so that the trolley stops 1/2" before hitting the stop bolt. If you have achieved the clearance needed to accommodate the relevant screen height see (D) above skip to step #4 below.
- 2. Remove the J-arm bolts sown in (A) and pull the safety release to disengage the trolley, slide the trolley forward toward the door jamb until it is almost level and re-install bolts into the J-arm. This will shorten the J-arm about 2".
- 3. Reset the down limit until the garage door seals to the floor
- 4. If the J-arm interferes with the screen door, cut the excess of the straight portion of the J-arm as shown in (B)
- 5. Tie off the cord handle to the J-arm as shown in (C).




### 1. Open only the frame bag at this time.


- 2. Lower the garage door to take the load off of the primary tracks.
- 3. Remove the bolts that connect the primary tracks to the existing back hang, install 2' Lifestyle perforated angle using existing bolt and the 5/16"x 1" bolt found in the frame bag.

### LIFESTYLE SCREENS 9'H AND 10'H MODELS: FRAME ASSEMBLY FIGURES






- 1. Four saw-horses are highly recommended to assemble the Lifestyle frame
- 2. Arrange the extrusions as shown above.
- 3. Fasten together the center verticals, the horizontals and the header horizontal using the 4" frame screws (20 pieces). Use a 1/4" magnetized nut driver.
- 4. Fasten the nylon straps with two of the 4" frame screws using the two outer holes that are set to the back of the top horizontal frame.




4. Arrange the two vertical frame members so the preinstalled weather stripping is on the outer edge and facing down. Insert the backer plates at each end of frame members and attach wheel brackets using the ¼-20x3/4"flanged head bolts found in the frame bag. The black plastic photo eye shield will slide between frame and bracket before doing the final tightening.

5. Attach wheel brackets to the ends of the horizontal frame members by inserting backer plate and fastening with ¼-20x3/4 flange head bolts found in frame bag.


Before tightening make sure wheel brackets are flush with the outside of frame –Top, bottom and side.



- **6.** Flip frame over so spline grooves are facing upward and apply the four 2" 3M weather seals flush with the ends of the horizontals
- 7. Spray the t-slots at the bottom of the door lightly with silicone spray and install the rubber astragal the entire length. Cut astragal about an 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " long and force the excess into the slots and then install 2" black end caps at each end.



- **8.** Assemble the magnets as shown above: Insert the nut into the upper t- slot and slide the magnet to the center of screen bay then tighten.
- 9. Insert 2" end plugs at the ends of top horizontal using a hammer and attach striker plate to magnet before putting the Lifestyle door into opening.



10. Position the screen mesh so that it is flush with the bottom outer edge of frame and past the vertical by at least 2", begin rolling the screen from right to left working in 6" intervals making sure the screen stays flush with the frame (See 1 above). Pull the other end of screen toward the top of frame making sure the margin of the screen is parallel with the vertical frame member, then roll the spline again from right to left working in 6" intervals (See 2 above) and keeping the screen taut. Repeat these steps for 3 and 4 above. Rolling each from top to bottom in turn.


11. Trim the screen by dragging the tip of the utility knife on outer edge of spline groove and applying medium pressure.

Always use a sharp blade when trimming screen and be sure that you trim the edge to the outside of the screen bay.




12. Center the screen frame between primary tracks and fasten the striker plates using  $1\,1/2$ " wood screw found in frame bag .

13. Level the screen frame with the opening, making sure you have the same margin across top. If frame is not level, shim the low side as shown above.

The bottom seal will fill this area when shim is removed .


Note: this must be done before installing tracks



14. Open the track bag next and bolt track curve to the vertical track using 5/8" track bolts and 1/4" serrated nuts. Make sure the track knock- out hole is located at the opposite end, that will be closest to the floor. Remove the knock-out using a hammer and screwdriver.

15. Hang the track curve and vertical on the top wheel bracket and mark one hole at the top and one hole at the bottom this will ensure that there is no interference when installing the Lifestyle jamb brackets.

Note: if track curve doesn't hang on the wheel, the vertical track should be trimmed at the bottom.




16. Bolt the 3 jamb brackets loosely to vertical track using the 5/8" track bolt and 1/4" serrated nuts found in the track bag.

NOTE: Hand tighten the bolts for the moment.

For 9'H and 10'H screens there are 3 jamb brackets for each vertical track.

17. Slide the track on to the wheels, make sure the jamb brackets are touching against the primary track. Fasten top jamb bracket to the jamb using the 1-1/2" lag bolts found in the track bag. Slide the track curve up against the primary track and tighten top track bolt. **Most Important:** For bottom jamb bracket slide the screen frame towards the jamb until the black weather strip just touches the jamb and tighten the bottom track bolt.

Now tighten the track bolt for the middle jamb bracket.




18. Arrange the horizontal tracks so they are opposite pairs. Bolt the 3" sheaves with the **1/4" bore** to the horizontal tracks using the 1" track bolts and 1/4" flange nuts found in track bag. Make sure the 3"sheave are mounted in the holes that are positioned 17" from the end of track.


Install 1/4"x 3/4" stop bolts toward the inside of track making sure the long portion of bolt and nut are inside of track.

19. Bolt the horizontal track to the track curve and the Lifestyle perforated angle using the 5/8" track bolts and 1/4" serrated flange nuts. Cut excess perforated angle flush with the bottom of horizontal.

**Note:** The distance between the primary track and the Lifestyle track will vary due the different types of j-arms, so it is best to trim the excess perforated angle off the back hang after you have verified sufficient clearances.

# OVERVIEW OF THE TORSION SPRING COUNTER-BALANCE SYSTEM OF THE 9'H AND 10'H MODELS





12' wide doors and under will require only 1 torsion spring as shown in Fig-1.

The springs and cable drums will be marked with red and black paint.

Red-meaning right side.


Black- meaning left side

16' wide doors will require 2torsion springs as shown in Fig-2

The springs and cable drums will be marked with red and black paint.

Red- meaning right side.

Black- meaning left side










## Always install bearing plates using the last set of holes supplied on horizontal tracks as shown in Fig-1


- **1.**Install bearing plates using 1/4-20x 5/8 track bolts, 1/4" flanged nuts and 1/4" fender washers.
- **2.**When installing bearing plates make sure the larger portion of bearings are facing inward as shown in Fig-2



1. Slide the torsion spring onto torsion tube 6" and hand tight bolts on the winding cone so spring doesn't slide while inserting torsion tube into the bearing plates.



2. Fasten the stationary cone to the **right hand** bearing plate using  $2-5/16 \times 1$ " hex bolts and 2-5/16" flanged nuts



This measurement should be a minimum of 5-3/4".






- 1.Remove the inner e-clip from cable pins and insert cable pin into bottom bracket as shown in Fig -1. Make sure cable pin can rotate freely.
- 2.Lubricate cable pin with silicone or a lithium grease as shown in Fig-2.




1. Route the cable from cable pin over 1-1/2" pulley mounted on tight radius and then over the 3" pulley mounted on horizontal track as shown above.






2.Hook cable to the cable drum making sure the red cable drum is used on the right side and the black cable drum is used for the left side. Slide the 1" bushing on the torsion tube and then cable drum and tighten as shown above. Make sure torsion tube sticks out past cable drum by 1"



3.Clamp vise grips on to the 1" portion of torsion tube at a 90 degree then slide a 24" piece of pipe on to vise grips. This will hold the cable tight while installing the opposite side.



- 1.Loosen the bolts on the winding cone that were hand tighten earlier.
- 2.Use the torsion spring chart to determine the amount of turns needed for your door.
- 3.Insert 1/2" winding bar or bars and rotate in the direction as shown above. **Note: For 16'** models the 2nd spring should be wound in the same direction.
- 4.Once the desired turns are reached tighten both set bolts on winding cone before removing the winding bar.



## Passage Door Installation Instructions

Lifestyle Screens garage door screens comes standard with the middle passage door. The Door Delete models do not have the middle passage door. If you have a door delete model please skip instruction #25.


If you have a passage door, you will have one of two types of passage doors: Lift-to-Latch and Milano. Instruction #25a pertains to the Lift-to-Latch passage door and Instruction #25b pertains to the Milano passage door










#### MOUNTING

- A. ALWAYS secure the Screen Cassette Assembly to the RIGHT JAMB of the doorway bay [1.2]
- B. The FLAT FACE of the Screen Cassette Assembly must ALWAYS FACE INSIDE [1.2]
- C. The CURVED FACE of the Screen Cassette Assembly must ALWAYS FACE OUTSIDE [1.2]




- D. ALWAYS install the Screen Cassette Assembly with the LARGE END-CAP of the Magnetic Latch pull-bar at the TOP of the doorway.
- E. ALWAYS install the Screen Cassette Assembly with the SMALL END-CAP of the Magnetic Latch pull-bar at the BOTTOM of the doorway.




#### INSTALLING THE CASSETTE

Using Panhead Screws, install the Mount Clips 10" from the top and bottom of the door opening, and one in the center [2.1]. Fasten the Screen Cassette Assembly onto the Mount Clips [2.2].

#### POSITIONING THE RAILS

There is a decorative groove on one side of the Top and Bottom Guide Rails. This groove should always face outside.

Slide the Top Guide Rail (the wide one) on to the tab of the top end-cap of the Screen Assembly Cassette. Slide the Bottom Guide Rail (the narrow one with weep holes) on to the tab of the bottom end-cap. To reduce the chance of the screen material fraying by rubbing against the metal edge, be sure to push the guide rails firmly and fully onto the tabs. [3.1]


## POSITION SIDE RAIL WITH MAGNET AND SECURE ALL RAILS WITH SCREWS


The side rail has a long leg and a short leg. The long leg must ALWAYS face outside.


Angle the Side Rail with Magnet behind and over the Top and Bottom Guide Rails, so that both are positioned inside the legs of the Side Rail [4.1].

Secure the three rails with three Panhead Screws each. One screw 6 inches from each end of each rail and one in the middle of each rail.

When installing the Top and Bottom Guide Rails, use the convenient Pile Opener to temporarily separate the two insect piles. This Pile Opener makes for easier viewing, access to and installation of the screws.









#### Secure Handle, Tighten Set Screws with Allen Wrench

The set screws securing the two Handles to the Magnetic Latch pull bar are loosely tightened at the factory.


Using the Allen wrench supplied with the unit, for each Handle slightly loosen the set screws, move the Handle to the vertical center of the Magnetic Latch pull bar and tighten securely. DO NOT OVERTIGHTEN OR THE SET SCREWS WILL STRIP.

NOTE: LEAVE THE ALLEN WRENCH WITH THE HOMEOWNER SO THAT HE/SHE CAN TIGHTEN THE SET SCREWS IN THE EVENT THAT THEY LOOSEN.






**26.** Remove the clip-on sensor from the primary track. Drill the rivets on sensor with a 1/4" drill bit and remove the clip portions. Bolt the sensor on to the Lifestyle track using a 1/4" x 5/8" track bolt and 1/4" serrated nut found in counter balance bag.

**26.** Remove the screws holding the sensor to the jamb. Reposition the sensor so the eye of the sensor is lined up with the knock out hole on the Lifestyle track and reinstall screws .



#### **FINAL CHECKS:**

Ensure that all nuts and bolts are completely tightened and securely fastened. Ensure that warning decals are properly placed on the Lifestyle screen frame.

For seamless operation, there should be approximately 1" of sideways play in the Lifestyle garage screen frame when it is in the horizontal stored position. When the magnet catch is disengaged from the striker plates on the garage door jamb, the bottom horizontal of Lifestyle screen should automatically rise approximately halfway up the Lifestyle vertical track. If this does not occur, you may have to adjust the spring stretch to achieve this result.

The Milano retractable passage door should move freely from the closed position with the magnets engaged to the open position, complete coiled in the screen canister. If the passage door does not retract fully you may need to ensure that there are the correct number of winds on the screen mandrill. For the 7'H screens, there should be 12 winds on the mandrill and for 8'H screens there should be 14 winds on the mandrill. Adjust operator's photo sensors so that beam projects through the gap between the garage door track and the Lifestyle garage screen tracks. There is a knockout slug in the Lifestyle screen track that can be struck from the inside of the track to allow the beam to project through the track. Typically, the distance from the floor to the centerline of the beam is to be no more than 6" from the garage floor. Refer to the operator's instruction manual for correct vertical placement of the photo eyes. Ensure photo eye brackets are secured to prevent accidental dislodging. Operator will not function properly if beam is interrupted.

Check the permanent garage door to make sure it is operating as it should. Check to see if the operator arm needs to be adjusted back into a different position. If this needs to be done, the straight protruding portion of the straight portion of the operator arm that protrudes beyond the curved portion may need to be cut to avoid hitting the screen door or rubbing/ripping the screen material. You will also need to verify that your operator is adjusted properly to pull the garage door up and out of the opening so that the screen door will close securely against the garage opening header. Important: Please refer to operator instruction manual for proper adjustment parameters. Do not exceed the operator manufacturer's recommendations for safe adjustment of the operator.

Adjusting the limit settings of the operator: Check the limit settings. Start the operator by pushing the standard wall push button or remote button. Be prepared to activate the button again quickly – per operator's installation/operation manual – or if you see that the door is going to over travel. Adjust the up travel limit so that the door comes to rest 3-4" (7-11 cm) beyond where it normally would without an operator. This is the starting point for the upward travel adjustments. Proceed to adjust the downward travel so that the door closes firmly without putting undue stress to the operator arm.

For operators equipped with safety strips or automatic reversal systems, it may be required to adjust the settings to ensure that the garage door will reverse if it were to make contact with the screen door without damaging either door. Final adjustment of the operator must comply with operator manufacturer's recommendations. Failure to do so may result in serious injury or death.

#### MAINTENANCE AND CARE FOR YOUR LIFESTYLE SCREEN

Your Lifestyle garage screen is a sturdy, durable and easy to use product. However, for optimum performance over the long run it is recommended that periodic maintenance as described below be performed.

- Use dry silicone spray to lube various points: rollers, top and bottom track of the center retractable passage door and the center bolt of the black pulley on the tight radius track curve. Avoid spraying any type of lube on the cable and pulleys.
- Before raising your Lifestyle garage screen from the vertical closed position to the horizontal open position it is recommended that you open the center retractable passage door into the screen canister.
- Always store your Lifestyle garage screen with the center retractable passage door in the rolled-up open position.
- To keep the screen mesh material clean use only a mild detergent with a sponge and hose down with water.

#### **OPTIONAL FEATURES AVAILABLE FOR YOUR LIFESTYLE GARAGE SCREEN**

Your Lifestyle garage screen comes with the following optional features:

- Locks for the center retractable passage door
- Pet blocker for use with the center retractable passage door to impede pets from passing under the loose bottom end of the mesh

The warranty period on a repaired or replaced Product is the remainder of the warranty on the original purchased Product or 30 days, whichever is longer.

The warranty is solely limited to parts. ASW does not warranty the workmanship of the professional installer.

If you discover a defect in material during the warranty period and ASW agrees that the defect exists, ASW will, at its sole option provide you, at no cost to you, with replacement parts for the defective parts. ASW may require proper proof of purchase documentation prior to issuing you a replacement part or Product.
